#### Descendants of Timothy Beach

1. **Timothy Beach** 7 Mar 1748, Unity Ch., North Stratford, Connecticut, (son of **Joseph Beach** and **Esther (Mansfield) Beach**) occupation Sea Fisherman, Farmer, m. ABT 1767, **Abigail (Bennett) Beach**, b. 14 May 1748, (daughter of **James Bennett** and **Abigail Esther (Curtiss) Bennett**) d. 22 May 1813, Bradford County, Pennsylvania, buried: Hilton Cemetery, West Burlington, PA. <sup>1</sup> Timothy died 1787, near Binghamton, New York, buried: between Owego & Binghamton along river. The BEACH FAMILY MAGAZINE, Vol. II, No. 1, p. 119, says he was born 7-May-1748 and married Abigail ——. One daughter is given, i.e., Deborah, born 1768 and married Josiah Priest. In "Corrections and Additions" at Vol. III, No. 1, p. 221, a son William is credited "on authority of Strong genealogy." Family records, however, say he was baptized as above and died by drowning near Binghamton, Broome County, New York. A descendant claims nine children in this family, but only the eight below are known by name. **Abigail**: Abigail, Timothy, Jr. and possibly several other young children made the trip with her husband, Timothy, to Catskill, NY in Nov. of 1784 and then up the Hudson to the Mohawk trail and went west to Cherry Valley and then down the Otsego Lake to the Susquehanna river and then down to the mouth of the Ouleout creek in East Sidney/Unadilla which was later Delaware Co. The farm they settled on was later the John M. Betts farm. This was found on the 1869 Sidney map. She married second, 1799, Jehiel Ferris. Moved to Bradford Co. PA.

2. **Deborah (Beach) Priest** (1. Timothy<sup>1</sup>) b. 1768, Stratford, CT., m. (1) ABT 1787/8, in Unadilla, NY, **Joseph Priest**, also known as: Josiah was said to also be his name. b. ABT 1762, Bolton, MA.,<sup>2</sup> (son of **Josiah Priest** and **Eunice (Jamison) Priest**) occupation Farmer around Unadilla, d. 1791/2, Unadilla, NY,<sup>3</sup> m. (2) 1792/3, in Unadilla, Otsego Co., NY., **Joseph Lull**, b. 1755, Ware, MA., (son of **Capt. Timothy Lull** and **Mary Huldah (Brown) Lull**) d. 26 Nov 1829, Unadilla, Otsego Co., NY. Deborah died 23 Jan. 1851, Thompson, Geauga Co., OH.<sup>4</sup> Deborah had two children by Joseph Priest and then married Joseph Lull and had 4 more children. She was listed in the 1830 Otsego Co. Census as widow. Gary Lull found she had moved to Troy, Bradford Co. PA., in Feb 03, 1842 but was only temporarily with some of her siblings on Jesse's farm. She went to Little Genesee, PA to the graduation of her son, Rev. William Lull where he studied to be a Dutch Reform minister. **Joseph**: It is thought that this person was the one that recorded Timothy's journey to Unadilla, NY in 1784, but it was his son. Joseph came to Unadilla in 1787 after Timothy passed through. Joseph possibly farmed on Timothy's farm. Notes of this journey may have been passed on to his son, Josiah, who was also an historian of the Catskills. Joseph died from pneumonia contracted in rescuing some people who had broken through the ice while crossing the, Susquehanna. river **Joseph**: Joseph was 8 when he went up the Connecticut River to Hartland, VT. and settled there in 1763. He fought the British at 10 since he was 6 foot tall and a man. This was at at Fort Royalton. He came to Unadilla about 1792/3. Joseph may have been married twice before. He served with Capt. Benjamin Cox's Company along with Lt. Green. Found a deed of sale of land from Joseph and Deborah to Josiah Priest of Albany in 1825. Also one by Deborah to Josiah in the same year. Both pieces of land were in Unadilla, NY.

10. i **Josiah A. Priest** b. 9 Dec 1788, Unadilla, Montgomery Co., NY, occupation Historical writer, m. (1) 5 Jul 1812, in Lansingburgh, Rensselaer Co., NY, divorced 1843, **Eliza (Perry) Priest**, b. 17 Jun 1789, Lansingburgh, NY, d. 17 Jul 1878, Buffalo, NY, m. (2) ABT 1844, in Ceres, McKean Co., PA?, **Adelia (Southworth) Priest**, b. ABT 1824, (daughter of **Henry Southworth** and **Adelia () Southworth**) d. Ceres, McKean Co., PA., buried: Family plot, unknown. Josiah died \_\_ Apr 1851, Genesee, Allegany Co., NY,<sup>5</sup> buried: Ceres Community Cemetery, Ceres, NY/PA. He lived in the area of Cairo, NY for a while and then moved to Albany. He wrote many books and pamphlets on history and early settlers of the Catskills. He also

traveled about selling his works as well as others. Some of his writing mentions his Beach relatives, especially Timothy and Ebenezer. Some of his writings also were about Mormon related subjects and might have been a Mormon. His middle name may be Addison like his sons. He was also a harness maker. In 1844 he moved to Ceres, McKean Co., PA and remarried. **Eliza**: No data has been found to show the divorce of Eliza from Josiah, but it is known that Josiah did leave Albany about 1844 and was found later in Ceres, PA married to Adelia Southworth. Why he went there is not known. Friendship, NY was close by to Ceres and Friendship was heavily populated by Mormons and a Sidney Rigdon resided there and once was the second highest official to the Mormon church, next to Joseph Smith. Josiah wrote many papers on the Mormons and seems more than a co-incidence that both show up about after 1840. **Adelia**: There is some confusion as to the maiden name of Adelia. Some say Easty and others say Southworth. It is unknown when and where Adelia were married, but possibly was in Ceres around 1844. Adelia's husband was also the justice of peace in Ceres which was on the PA side of Ceres, not NY. Charles Barrett found later that Adelia was a Southworth, not Easty. She married William Keyser after Josiah died.

11. ii **Francis Asbury Priest** b. 24 Jul 1792, Unadilla, Osego Co., NY, occupation Manuf. of bobbins, m. 4 Sep 1817, in Steubenville, Jefferson Co., OH.,<sup>6</sup> **Lydia (Steele) Priest**, b. 27 Dec 1801, New Connecticut or Western Reserve, OH., d. 14 Nov 1879, Steubenville, Jefferson Co., OH.,<sup>7</sup> buried: 16 Nov. 1879, Steubenville, Jefferson Co., OH. Francis died 29 Nov 1873, Steubenville, Jefferson Co., OH.<sup>8</sup> Based on the name he might have been a minister. Descendants of Francis and Lydia Priest from Jay Priest, jpriest@frontiernet.net . Francis and Lydia were said to have 5 more children born between 1817 and 1873. He ran a successful business on Liberty St., one of the earliest in the area. Served as a "fifer" in war of Plattsburg, NY of 1812 and enlisted 8 Sep 1814 and discharges 21 Sep 1814 at Salem, NY. He was in Capt. Harkness Co. Militia. **Lydia**: She came to Steubenville with her mother Mrs. David Hull and had a brother, Matthew Steele who ran one of the first businesses there with Benjamin Fagg making carding machines. Francis Asbury worked in this same building with his business. She was the mother of 15 children, 8 boys and 7 girls, 31 grandchildren, 11 great grandchildren. 8 children were living at her death. She was a member of the M.E. church and when the Methodist Protestant church formed she joined that.

ABT 1796,<sup>9</sup> d. 28 Aug 1853, Cannonsville, Delaware Co., NY,<sup>10</sup> buried: Cannonsville, reburied in Pepacton, NY.<sup>11</sup> Rev. died 5 Jul 1868, Cannonsville, Delaware Co., NY., buried: Cannonsville, reburied in Pepacton, NY.<sup>12</sup> Graduated school in Little Genesee, PA. as a Dutch Reformed minister about 1842. He was a minister in Fishkill, NY. in 1844. Later he was a minister in Cannonsville, NY. where he died. **Eunice**: Eunice was first married to a Mr. ? Lanthorpe.
13. iv **Esther (Lull) Vanenburgh** b. 1806, Unadilla, Otsego Co., NY., m. **Potter Vanenburgh**. She was living in Thompson, Ohio in 1852. This is where her mother, Deborah, died the year before. Gary Lull said that Esther applied for war pension of her father, Joseph Lull, but was denied it and believed they may have confused it with her stepfather Joseph Priest who had went AWOL while in the VT. Reg. because they made him stay 6 months more than his 3 three enlistment. There was an Esther Lull listed as a teacher in Bushland, NY. and also an Emma Lull.
14. v **Jerusha Lull** b. ABT1808, Unadilla, NY?, m. 1831, in Otsego, NY, **Lysander (Hathaway) Lull**, b. 1808. Jerusha died 10 Dec. 1835.<sup>13</sup>
15. vi **Marcus Scott Lull** b. ABT1811, m. 1 Nov 1894, **Lydia Ann (Getman) Lull**, b. 1821, Palermo, Oswego, NY. Marcus died 20 Jan 1865, Salisbury, NC. He was captured in Reams Station, VA.. Union Corp., Prisoner of War at "Little Anderson, Prison".

3. **Richard Mansfield Beach** (1.Timothy<sup>1</sup>) b. C. 1770-74, m. **Lucinda (Root) Beach**, b. 6 May 1780, Hebron, Tolland County, Connecticut, (daughter of **Daniel Root** and **Mindwell (Root) Root**) d. AFT 1838, Possibly in MI. Richard died C. 1830-40. Other children are suggested by the Federal Censuses of 1800 to 1840, such that the list below may be incomplete. It is thought that this son was the one that first traveled with his father when he was twelve in 1784 from CT. to Sidney/Unadilla, NY. He and his father returned for his mother and other siblings to settle in Sidney near the mouth of the Ouleout creek at the Susquehanna river in the Delaware region later to become Delaware Co. in 1797. 1800-30 census records indicate possibly 3 more child, 1M and 2 F. **Lucinda**: In 1838 Lucinda, of Sidney, did not sign grantor deed.

17. ii **Marcia (Beach) McMinn** b. C. 1802, Franklin, Delaware County, New York, m. **William McMinn**.
18. iii **Gordon Mansfield Beach** b. 11 Jun 1804, Franklin, Delaware County, New York, occupation Basket Maker, farmer, m. (1) 3 Nov 1830, in Walton, NY.,<sup>15</sup> **Mary (St. John) Beach**, also known as: Polly b. 22 Jun 1808, Walton, Delaware County, New York, (daughter of **Cook St. John** and **Anna (Benedict) St. John**) d. 3 Nov

1844, Delaware Co., NY, m. (2) 14 Mar 1844,<sup>16</sup> **Malinda (Niles) Beach**, b. 5 Dec 1824, Coventry, Chenango County, New York, (daughter of **Calvin Niles** and **Abigail (Chandler) Beach**) d. 7 Nov 1886, Elkhart County, Indiana, buried: 9 Nov 1886, Grace Lawn Cem. Elkhart, IN. Gordon died 9 Jan 1895, Elkhart County, Indiana, buried: 12 Jan 1895, Grace Lawn Cem. Elkhart, IN. He settled near Simonton Lake, Osolo Township, Elkhart County, Indiana. Compare the date of death of the 1st wife to the marriage date of the 2nd wife. Unless there is a problems with this data, the 2nd marriage occurred 8 months the first wife died. Was there a divorce with the first wife?

4. **William "Pump" Beach** (1.Timothy<sup>1</sup>) b. C. 1774-80, occupation Pedler and Writer, m. **Philena (Root) Beach**, b. 15 Jan 1782, (daughter of **Daniel Root** and **Mindwell (Root) Root**) d. 4 Nov 1860, Walton, Delaware County, New York. William died C. 1840-50, probably in Elkhart County, Indiana. Emily, daughter of William, said in some of her writings that William led a nomadic sort of life as a pedler and was a writer of rude verse. William and Philena of Elkhart Co., IN sold their 1/5 (each) shares of Philena's father's estate to Charles L. Strong of Franklin. **Philena**: Philena was the sister Lucinda Root.

- 22. i **Erastus Beach** b. 1802, m. **Betsy (?) Beach**. He moved from NY about 1837 as a pioneer in Elkhart, IN., but later moved to Cass Co., MI. where bought large land and operated a sawmill. About 1856 he went to CA. in Sierra Co. and was elected JP of San Juan and served several years until his death. Information came from "Standard History of Elkhart County, Indiana, Vol. 1 & Vol. 2, Abraham E. Weaver 1916; Vol. 2 p. 854., bio of Mrs. Harriet Compton.
- 23. ii **Fanny (Beach) Ballard** b. 1806, NY, m. **Ira P. Ballard**, b. ABT 1800, occupation Farmer, d. 25 Apr 1893. It was said that Fanny had several children. **Ira**: He was a successful and prosperous farmer in Troy, PA.
- 24. iii **William Beach** b. 25 Oct 1807, m. **Harriet (Buell) Beach**, (daughter of **Abel Buell**).
- 25. iv **Jehial Beach** b. 29 May 1808, m. 13 Oct 1831, **Mary Ann (Strong) Beach**, b. 13 Jan 1813, (daughter of **Alfred Strong, Sr.** and **Martha (Smith) Strong**) d. ABT 1878, buried: Walton Cemetery, Walton, New York.<sup>17</sup> Jehial died 10 Aug 1878, Delaware County, New York, buried: Walton Cemetery, Walton, New York.<sup>18</sup> **Mary**: Mary Ann Strong was of Walton, NY.
- 26. v **Emily (Beach) DeWitt** b. 15 Jul 1810, m. **Morgan DeWitt**. This might have been the Emily (Beach) DeWitt that wrote about her father. There is no data found yet that proves the marriage to a DeWitt. There were DeWitts living in West Burlington, Bradford, Co., PA. A letter was found between Elizabeth White R? and Mrs. Clyde Edna Capwell in 1933 that said Emily married Morgan DeWitt of W. Burlington and was the author of a Beach sketch. She was from Franklin, NY. which seems to prove that Emily is William "Pump" Beach's daughter. **Morgan**: Morgan was of West Burlington, PA.
- 27. vi **Amanda Beach** b. 29 Jun 1812, m. 15 Jun 1831, in Franklin, Delaware County, New York,<sup>19</sup> **Lewis Hart**. **Lewis**: He was from Ward, MA.

6. **Daniel Beach** (1.Timothy<sup>1</sup>) b. 29 May, 1780, CT.,<sup>20</sup> occupation Hotel/Tavern owner, m. 1802/4, in Franklin, NY, **Lurinda (Barnes) Beach**, also known as: Lucinda b. 10 Jan 1781, Branford, New Haven, CT., (daughter of **Ebenezer Barnes, Jr.** and **Thankful (Warner) Barnes**) d. 11 Aug 1864, Franklin, Delaware Co., NY. Daniel died 20 Aug 1838, Franklin, Delaware County, New York, buried: Baptist Church Cemetery, Franklin, NY.<sup>21</sup> His status as a child of Timothy and Abigail (Bennett) Beach was uncertain, but found he owned the Daniel Beach Hotel 2 mi. west of Franklin, NY (Pioneers of Unidilla Village, Halsey 1902, p191). Daniel's will dated 16 Aug 1838 and was from Franklin, Delaware Co., NY. His heirs were wife Lurinda, son, Augustus and dau. Marie/Mariah, wife of Wm. Betts, Jr. This in was part of a large building with two chimneys, one on each end. The tap room was on the left toward the village and the other end was the inn. The tap room had several rooms and kitchen for the stage travelers, but was mainly for the more rowdy folks and the inn portion for those with more wealth and need for privacy. The inn had about 5 fireplaces and the tap room portion had about 7. The property was on some 28 acres of land and appears to have had the tavern/inn and other out buildings there before Daniel obtained it. There is a large barn across the street from the inn that is multi leveled to house horses and stables and farm equipment. There was a tool shop in the barn for the farm use and possibly for repairing the stables.

The tavern was previously owned by Hugh Thompson and his wife Sally who put it up for sale after foreclosure on the mortgage at a public venue on 25 Dec 1828. He was one of several tavern owners in Franklin, many dating back to about 1810, but this tavern was the only one outside of the center of the village toward Unadilla on the Susquehanna/Catskill Turnpike.

Daniel bought it for \$150.00 as the highest bidder. Sluman Bartlett was the Commissioner of Deeds. The indentured deed for

the land on Lot #34, surveyed by Peter Von Burgh Livingston, was transferred to Daniel by Obadiah Sands on 4 Feb 1829. A license to keep an inn was acquired by Daniel in 1832 for \$5.

This location was later part of the farm of a family named Haight. Today it is the home of Joe and Donna Otello and they have been restoring it to its original state as the inn Daniel once ran. This place is much smaller since the tavern portion is gone now. It is located about 1 mile north of the center of the village of Franklin on Rte. 357. **Lurinda**: This was listed in records given by Eugene Beach, but I believe to be confused with wife of Daniel P. Beach, who is the son of Jesse Mansfield Beach. Janace Cole found additional data on this Daniel which concludes that this Daniel is not the same as Daniel P., maiden name of this Lucinda was Barnes, given by Nadine Beach Phillips. Therefore this Daniel is in fact the son of Timothy and Daniel P. is the son of Jesse Mansfield Beach.

29. i **Maria (Beach) Betts** also known as: Mariah b. 6 May 1804, Delaware County, New York, m. 10 Feb 1823, in Franklin, Delaware Co., NY.,<sup>22</sup> **William Betts, Jr.**, b. 10 Apr 1802, Franklin, Delaware Co., NY.,<sup>23</sup> (son of **William Betts, Sr.** and **Lydia (?) Betts**) occupation Farmer, d. 17 Oct 1863, Franklin, Delaware Co., NY. **William**: There were several Betts living in the area at the time. Confusion as to who the parents of William were. Augustus Beach's wife, Maria, was the daughter to Peter Betts, but we have found several Peter Betts in the area over many years and have not verified which one is Maria's parents. There was a Peter Betts that ran a tavern before Daniel Beach. Also Timothy Beach was said to have settled on the land later know as that of the Hon. Sheriff John M. Betts and is now the Johnson Dairy farm. William was known as Col. Betts.
30. ii **Augustus Beach** b. 8 Jul 1805, Franklin, Delaware County, New York, m. 13 Mar 1827, **Maria (Betts) Beach**, also known as: Marian or Catherine Mariah b. 3 Jan 1804, VT.,<sup>24</sup> (daughter of **Peter Betts** and **Maria (Preston) Betts**) d. 12 Aug 1883, Hartwick, NY., buried: Franklin, NY. Augustus died 13 Feb 1865, Franklin, Delaware County, New York.<sup>25</sup> Augustus's will was filed 14 Feb. 1865 and probated on 17 March 1865. Mentions wife as Catherine Mariah and Executor as John Edgerton and witnesses: John H. Edgerton and Rebecca Wright of Franklin, NY. Augustus and Maria lived near the tavern and helped Lurinda after the death of Daniel, but later moved up the road about a 1 1/4 miles on the road to Walton where he ran a farm and was a teamster. There has been some thought that Augustus might have been married to another wife earlier. **Maria**: The name of Catherine Mariah was mentioned in the "Wills Abstracts" of Delaware Co., NY. found at the LA library by Janace Cole. This was for Augustus Beach of Franklin, probated 17 March 1865. Maria had a sister that married a Bedford and they were said to have been inn operators in Delaware and Otsego counties. After Augustus died, Maria moved to Hartwick to live with both sons. When she died they placed her body on in a wagon and pulled it to Franklin to be buried, but site has not been found.
7. **Esther (Beach) Fanning** (1. Timothy<sup>1</sup>) b. 6 Apr 1781, CT., m. (1) **James McKean, Jr.**, (son of **James McKean, Sr.** and **Mrs. () McKean**) occupation Farmer, d. 1822, West Burlington, PA.,<sup>26</sup> m. (2) 8 Apr 1824, in Leona, Springfield TWP, Bradford Co., PA, **Elisha Fanning, Jr.**, b. 4 Sep 1780, Groton, CT, (son of **Elisha Fanning, Sr.** and **Mary (Button) Fanning**) occupation Farmer, d. 2 Nov 1859, Leona, Springfield TWP, Bradford Co., PA, buried: Checkerville Cemetery, S. Creek TWP, PA. Esther died 3 Oct 1857, Leona, Springfield TWP, Bradford Co., PA., buried: Leona Cemetery. **Elisha**: When he moved to West Springfield, MA with his parents and in 1812 to the pioneer settlement in Springfield, PA. He cleared and improved the land in Leona where he died. He was one of the original members of the Methodist Society of Leonard Hollow. In 1870 was living next door to William and wife Abigail

In 1880 living with daughter Ann "Libby" Griffith and husband. **Martha**: 1850 census, Springfield TWP, says Maria Boyer, 8, living ther at the time. In 1880 Census said she was wife, 62 living with daughter Ann Elizabeth Griffith and family.

The names and number of his children should be considered tentative. His name was found in a letter to the US Patent Office in 1849 for a washing machine. **Sarah**: Timothy may have found this Sprague in Unadilla or around Walton, NY. Some thought that Timothy did not come to Unadilla with his father and mother from CT, but maybe came West later and married her. Other data strongly suggests that Timothy was in Unadilla before his father died and went to West Burlington, PA. Emily Beach DeWitt's "sketches" indicate Timothy was in West Burlington, PA. in his early years before he married. It is thought that the first 4 children were born in PA. or along the NY. border.

There is a private Leonard family burial in the Hilton. We have not found any connection to Beach. **Margaret**: Margaret and Jesse celebrated their 60th Wedding Anniversary. She died 6 months later. Jesse lived near the West Burlington, PA settlement. It is thought he was living on property that his father, Timothy, purchased within the 3 years he lived in Unadilla before he died from an accident on the Susquehanna River near Binghamton, NY. Daniel died 18 Jan 1897, At his home East Smithfield, PA.,<sup>59</sup> buried: 20 Jan 1897, Turnpike Cemetery, East Smithfield, PA.<sup>60</sup> His wife's stone was found at the Hilton Cemetery, but Daniel's stone was not found.
