This Indenture, Made this 25th day of
November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
Eighty Six Between John Armstrong and
Amelia Armstrong his wife of the town of
Cornelia, Delaware County, New York

of the first part, and George M. Bailey of
the town, county & state aforesaid

of the second part,

Witnesseth, That the said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of

Twenty five

Dollars,

to them duly paid, have sold, and

By these Presents, do grant and convey to the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns, All that certain tract or
parcel of land Situate in the village of
Carmontville in the town of Tonawanda aforesaid
and bounded as follows. Beginning at
the Southwest corner of the Schoolhouse lot
and running thence in an Easterly direction along
the line of the School house lot two rods and
twelve links to an iron post Thence in a North
westerly direction ten rods to an iron post on
the Easterly side of the burying ground. Thence in
a westerly direction along the East line of the
burying ground four rods and twelve links to a
post at the Southeast corner of the burying
ground. Thence in a Southwesterly direction
ten rods to the place of beginning containing
thirty four and $\frac{4}{5}$ square rods of land be the
same more or less. It is further agreed that
if there should be a street laid out through the
orchard to intersect Cemetery Street the party of
the second part is to give twelve feet off the lot
hereby conveyed next to the School District lot
for a street and open the same.

With the Appurtenances, and all the Estate, Title and Interest therein of the said parties of the first part. And the said John Armstrong and Ann Armstrong do hereby covenant and agree to and with the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, that the premises thus conveyed in the Quiet and Peaceable Possession of the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns they will forever Warrant and Defend against any person whomsoever lawfully claiming the same, or any part thereof.
