At a meeting of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Delaware held at their room of in the Court House in Delhi on the 10th day of November in the year 1846.

Election of Chairman and Clerk

Isaac Burr of Meredith was appointed Chairman and **Amasa J. TenBroeck** chosen Clerk.

Presentation of District Attorney's Bill

Several Town accounts were here passed.

The District Attorney, **Truman H. Wheeler**, here served his bill against the County on the Clerk. On **motion ordered Amasa Parker**, Esquire Supreme Court Commissioner tax the same tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock.

Committee appointed to examine & audit Town Accounts

On **motion of Mr. Allaben ordered** that a Select Committee be appointed by the Chairman to examine the accounts of the boards of the Town Auditors of the several Towns.

The Chairman appointed the following named persons as such committee, to wit:

Mr. Allaben, Mr. Townsend, Mr. Goodrich

On **motion** board adjourned until tomorrow morning at 8 o'clock.

November 11th, 1846

Board met pursuant to adjournment. The Chair announced the appointment of the following Standing Committees.

To Equalize the Assessment Rolls

Messrs. Keator, McKinnon, Allaben, Miller, Hutson, Griffin and Peake

To Settle with Treasurer

Messrs. Maples, Bennett & Stott

To Settle with U.S.D.F. Loan Commissioners and Commissioners of Loans of 1808

Messrs. Odell, Edgerton & Townsend

To Settle With Superintendents of Poor

Messrs. Maples, Bennett & Stott, Jr.

To Examine Court House and Jail

Messrs. Edgerton, Hanmer, Hutson

On Motion of *Mr. Maples*

Resolved That no accounts shall be audited by this board unless presented at its first meeting, except the accounts of the members of said board.

Sanford J. Ferguson's bill as County Superintendent of Common Schools was here presented and passed as claimed with the exception of charges for inspecting teachers which was reduced to 25 cts per teacher.

On **motion** *ordered* that the accounts of **Mr. E. B. Sheldon** County Clerk be put over until the next meeting to be audited.

On **motion** of *Mr. Edgerton* the vote allowing **Sanford J. Ferguson** 25 cts for examining teachers was rescinded and on his further **motion** it was *ordered* that he be allowed 50 cts in lieu thereof.

The District Attorneys bill was here taxed by **Amasa Parker, Esquire**, Supreme Court Commissioner, and was audited by the Board at \$300.

Board adjourned until tomorrow morning 8 o'clock.

November 12th, 1846

Board met pursuant to adjournment.

The Committee appointed to settle with Treasurer here made their report, by which they find the County in debt to the amount of \$1411.19. Said report was accepted and is on file.

The Committee appointed to settle with Superintendents of the Poor also made their report, by which it appears that said Superintendents have drawn upon the Treasurer to the amount of \$2287.68. Said report was accepted and is on file.

The Equalizing Committee here appeared before the Board that they had raised the following. The following amount per cent on the Real Estate, to wit:

Davenport 6 per ct

Franklin 3 "

Hamden 3 "

Harpersfield 6 "

Meredith 10 "

Kortright 5 "

Mr. Maples moved that the report be accepted. Ayes & Noes were here demanded.

Ayes: *Mr. Stott, Mr. Hanmer, Mr. Hutson, Peake, Miller, Griffin, McKinnon, Allaben, Keator, Odell, Bennett, Maples - 12*

Noes: *Messrs. Goodrich, Edgerton, Harper, Burr, Townsend - 5.*

Mr. Morse declining to vote.

So the report was accepted.

The Committee appointed the accounts of the several boards of Town auditors, made their report, which was accepted and is on file.

On **motion** of *Mr. Edgerton*

Resolved That an amount equal to the amount of School money furnished by the State, be raised by each Town respectively for the support of Common Schools.

On like **motion**

Resolvedd That the sum of \$2000 be raised and appropriated for the Support of the Poor of the County for the ensuing year.

On **motion** of *Mr. Maples*

Resolved That the sum of \$350.00 be raised and appropriated for the purpose of finishing and furnishing the fire proof Clerk's Office.

On **motion** *Ordered* that the Board proceed to elect a Treasurer by ballot for the ensuing year. Upon canvassing the ballots it appeared that **Harvey R. Millard** had a majority of all the votes cast & he was thereupon declared duly elected.

On like **motion** *ordered* that the Board proceed to elect 3 Superintendents of the Poor for the ensuing year. And upon the canvass of the ballots it appeared that the following gentlemen had a majority of all the votes cast and were declared duly elected. To wit:

George Thompson of Andes

William Laughran of Roxbury

Lloyd Briggs of Sidney

The Treasurer, **Mr. Millard**, here presented his bond in the penal sum of \$20,000 sureties. **Mr. William Millard, Giles M. Shaw, Almiron Fitch.** On **motion** bond was accepted by the Board and approved by the Chairman.

On **motion** *Ordered* that the Board proceed by ballot to determine how the County canvass of this should be published.

On **motion** *Ordered* that the above vote be rescinded, and that the County Clerk be directed to furnish each of the County papers with a copy of said County canvass.

On **motion** Board adjourned until tomorrow morning 8 o'clock.

November 13th, 1846

Board met pursuant to adjournment.

The Committee to settle with Justices and Constables presented a written report which was accepted and is on file.

On **motion** of *Mr. Edgerton*

Resolved That the Grand Jury lists made out by each member of the Board at this meeting be the Grand Jurors for the ensuing year.

A **motion** was made by *Mr. Edgerton* that the report of the Equalising Committee be amended, and **Andes** reduced five per cent and **Delhi** raised five per cent.

Ayes and Noes called for.

Ayes: *Messrs. Morse, Goodrich, Edgerton, Harper, Burr, Odel, Maples, Townsend - Eight*

Noes: *Messrs Stott, Hanmer, Hutson, Peake, Miller, Griffin, McKinnon, Allaben, Keator, Bennet. Ten.* So the **motion** was lost.

The following **resolution** was offered and unanimously passed

Resolved that in our opinion the late Superintendents of the Poor of the County of Delaware have faithfully and honorably discharged the duties of said office with credit to themselves, and with satisfaction to the County.

On **motion** of *Mr. Edgerton*

Resolved that the sum of \$8500.00 be raised to meet the County expenses for the ensuing year.

On **motion** *Ordered* that if there is not sufficient money raised to defray the expenses of the County that the Treasurer be authorized to borrow a sufficient sum for that purpose.

A **motion** was made that the vote on the Blacksmith's bill for shoeing the horses of the Sheriffs posse be rescinded.

Ayes & noes called for.

Ayes: *Messrs. Goodrich, Edgerton, Miller, Harper, McKinnion, Odell, Maples, Townsend = 8.*

Noes: *Messrs. Morse, Stott, Hanmer, Hutson, Peake, Burr, Allaben, Keator, Bennett = 9.*

So the **motion** lost.

On **motion** Board adjourned until 10 o'clock of December next.

Tuesday December 10th, 1846

Board met pursuant to adjournment and proceeded to sign the Tax Rolls and then adjourned for dinner.

After dinner Board met as usual.

A **motion** was made by *Mr. Allaben* that an account in favor of **Mr. O. N. Steele**, now deceased, for services rendered the Delhi and Middletown Turnpike Company, be audited and charged against the County.

Ayes and noes demanded. Those who voted in the affirmative were Messrs. *Morse, Stott, Burr, Allaben*. Ayes 4. Those who voted in the negative were Messrs. *Hanmer, Goodrich, Hutson, Edgerton, Peake, Miller, Harper, Griffin, Odell, Bennett, Maples, Townsend*. Noes 12. So the **motion** was lost.

The Committee appointed to settle with the Commissioner of Loans of 1808 & the Commissioners of the U.S.D. Fund here made their report, which were accepted and are on file.

On **motion** *Ordered* that the County Treasurer receive as a compensation for his services the amount of one half per cent on all moneys received and one half per cent on all moneys paid out by him.

On **motion**

Resolved that the Treasurer be authorized to obtain a loan of \$1000 for a period not exceeding 60 days in order to meet a demand in favor of the Comptroller of the State against the County for that amount due on the first day of January next.

On **motion** of *Mr. Morse* *Ordered* that the County printing be done by the three papers therein provided they shall each of them do the same for half pay.

On **motion** *ordered* that a Committee of three be appointed for the purpose of conferring with three printers of the County to ascertain the three papers will publish the State laws at the same price that two would do the same for. The chair appointed

Mr. Edgerton, McKinnon & Morse as such Committee.

On **motion** of *Mr. Maples*

Resolved That provided the next board shall concur the Board of Supervisors will not hereafter receive and audit any accounts against the County unless the same be presented at its first meeting.

A **motion** was here made to adjourn which was lost.

On further **motion**

Resolved the Clerk of this Board receive \$140 for his services.

The Committee appointed to confer with the printers reported separately. *Mr. Edgerton* reported that he had called on **Mr. Paine** who stated that he would publish the laws for one third of the amount paid two papers. *Mr. McKinnon* stated that **Mr. Brown** would do the same. *Mr. Morse* stated **Mr. McCauley** thought it WORKING pretty cheap, but that if it was done, he would fall into the measure.

A **motion** was here made to adjourn which was lost.

On **motion** of *Mr. Edgerton*

Resolved That the Board proceed to elect two printers to publish the laws of the State by ballot.

On canvassing the ballots the following persons elected as such printers, viz:

William S. Hawley & Anthony M. Paine

On **motion** the Board adjourned until tomorrow morning 8 o'clock.

December 11, 1846

Board met pursuant to adjournment.

The late Superintendents here made their report which was accepted and is on file.

Mr. Edgerton offered the following **resolution** which was adopted.

Resolved That the Committee for building the fire proof Clerk's Office be authorized to allow in addition to the \$950, as such amount as they shall be satisfied on examination of the expenses, shall be just for extra work and loss to the builder on the contract above the \$950, after the building is complete, not to exceed \$450.00.

On **motion** of *Mr. Stott* *Ordered* That the Committee to Superintend the County Clerk's Office be directed to attend the furnishing, as well as finishing of the same.

On **motion** of *Mr. Keator*

Resolved That the Legislature be requested to abolish the Office of County Superintendent of Common Schools of this County.

A **motion** was made by *Mr. Odell* that **Milo B. Sheldon** be authorized to fix the indexes of the records of deeds & mortgages in the Clerk's Office of this County pursuant to law, which was lost.

On **motion** Board adjourned to meet on the 1st Tuesday in January next, at 10 o'clock a.m.

Ayes and noes were demanded and on being called by the Clerk the following was the result:

Mr. Allaben here appeared before the Board and in behalf of the *Deposit Bridge Company* applied for a Charter for said company under the act entitle "*an act to provide for the Corporation of Bridge Companies passed April 11th, 1848*" and after hearing of argument on behalf of said company it is hereby *ordered* that the Charter be granted.

Ayes: **Gladstone, Lee, Holliday, Yendes, Emmons, Edgerton, Launt, Bragg, Miller, D. McDonald, Mitchell, Kelly, A. McDonald, Hughston & Mead.** **Maples** refused to vote.

In the matter of maintaining and keeping up the bridge at Deposit, it satisfactorily being made to appear that a number of persons not less than five residing in Delaware County have formed themselves into a body corporate under the name and style of the *Deposit Bridge Company* in pursuance to an act entitled "*an act to provide for the corporation of Bridge Companies passed April Eleventh 1848*" and that they have complied with all the provisions of said act requisite for the formation of said body corporate and it also appearing that said Bridge was in process and construction by private subscription as the passage of said act and is now completed and that said Bridge Corporation has given notice that it shall apply at this meeting of the Board for permission to maintain and keep up the same for the space of fifty years from the sixth day of September last by publication once in each week for at least six weeks successively previous to this time in the *Deposit Courier* -- paper printed in said County according to law and preformed all other acts required to be done before making said application and after hearing **Mr. J. R. Allaben** in behalf of the application and it appearing to the Board that the publics interest would be promoted by keeping up and maintaining said bridge on **motion** of **Mr. Edgerton** of Franklin ordered that said company be authorized to keep up and maintain said bridge for the term of fifty years from the sixth day of September last. Said bridge is located at the Village of Deposit across the West Branch of the Delaware River between the easterly end of Broad Street on the west side of said river and the highway leading to

Hancock. On the easterly side there of said bridge is provided with two arches each one one hundred and twenty feet span resting on stone abutments at each shore and a pair in the middle and the chords are sixteen feet above low water marks. The abutments of dry masonry the stone of size suitable to make the work strong and substantial the ice breakers and pair of -- oak timber planked with oak three inches thick twenty feet above low water mark and filled with stone to the top of the planking the chords of good Hemlock aspen the arches of pine. The Bridge is at least sixteen feet wide in the clear inside and covered with good shingles and the sides covered with good season white pine inch boards and well supported by rafters, bolts, -- and braces. And the planking of the Bridge is three inches thick of good hemlock.

Every horse and rider six cents. Every score of cattle, horses, and in proportion for any numberless 20 cents. Every score of sheep or hogs in proportion for any number less ten cents. Every sleigh or sled drawn by two horses, oxen or mules 9 cents. Every additional horse, oxen or mule 3 cents. Every cutter sleigh or sled drawn by one horse, oxen or mule 6 cent. Every footman 3 cents.

On **motion** of ***Mr. Yendes***

Resolved that the list of Grand Jurors as made out by the Board of Supervisors be the Grand Jurors for the ensuing year.

The committee appointed to examine the Court House, Jail and Clerk's Office, through their chairman ***Mr. Bragg***, report that in their opinion tops should be put about the jail chimneys. BILL

An act for the protecting of certain kinds of game, fish and eels, within the borders of Delaware County.

Sec. 1st No person shall kill any wild buck, doe or fawn, at any time during the months of January, February, March, April, May, June, or July.

Sec. 2nd No person shall put, cast or throw into any of the waters of this County, any of the berry community called "Cocolus Judicus", whether it be mixed with any other substance or not or any poisonous substance whatever for the purpose of destroying or taking any fish

being in any of said waters.

Sec. 3rd No Person or persons, not a resident or resident of this County, shall be permitted to hunt, chase, catch or destroy any deer, fish or eels, within the borders of said County, except by a license from some Justice of the Peace of the town where such game, fish or eels are --- on such terms as the Justice in his direction may deem proper.

Sec. 4th Any person or persons found guilty of a violation of this act, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable wither by fine or imprisonment, in the County gaol or both; the fine not to exceed \$100.00 nor less then ten dollars, and the imprisonment not to exceed 90 days nor less than 10 days.

Sec. 5th This act is to take effect on the first day of January, in the year 1850.

Mr. T. H. Wheeler here appeared before the Board and presented a bill against the County in favor of **Green More**.

There has been a large increase the past year of out door Poor; as you will notice in our report above, and thereby there has been drawn from the poor fund some fourteen hundred dollars for the relief and expenses of the out door poor which is wholly under the control of the Town Overseers of the Poor of the several Towns and of which we cannot direct to any extent.

The inmates of the County House many of them have been the last year sick with the prevailing diseases of the Summer season, consequently you will notice the increase of the Physicians' bill from last year, but are now in a comfortable, clean and healthy condition.

The Children have been instructed by a competent teacher, and are making reasonable improvement. All of which is respectfully submitted.

DELAWARE COUNTY LAWS

LAW of the County of Delaware, passed at the Annual Session of the Board of Supervisors of said County held in November and December, 1849, at the town of Delhi.

CHAPTER 1

AN ACT for the protection of certain kinds of Game, Fish and Eels within the borders of Delaware County.

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Delaware in the State of New York do enact as follows:

Section 1: No person shall kill any wild buck, deer or fawn, at any time during the months of January, February, March, April, May, June, nor July.

Section 1: No person shall put, cast or throw into any of the waters of this County, any of the berry commonly called Coccus Indicus, whether it be mixed with any other substance or not, or any poisonous substance whatever; for the purpose of destroying or taking any fish being in said waters.

Section 3: No person or persons, not a resident or residents of this County, shall be permitted to chase, hunt, catch or destroy any deer, fish or eels, within the borders of said County, except by a license from some Justice of the Peace of the town where such game fish or eels are sought, on such terms as the Justice in his discretion may deem proper.

Section 4: Any person or persons found guilty of a violation of this Act, shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor punishable either by fine or imprisonment in the County Jail, or both; the fine not to exceed one hundred dollars, nor less than ten dollars, and the imprisonment not to exceed ninety days nor less than ten days.

Section 5: This act shall take effect on the first day of January, in the year 1850.

The *Freeman's Advocate* went down and did not print laws.

Mr. Horton presented a bill for the destruction of noxious animals & c. the following is a copy of the same as amended.

"An Act to Encourage the destruction of Wolves & other noxious animals."

Passed **Nov. 15, 1850**

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Delaware do enact as follows -

Section 1st - Every person being at the time an inhabitant of the County who shall kill a full grown wolf or a wolfs whelp within the County of Delaware shall be entitled to a bounty of ten dollars for each full grown Wolf and five dollars for each wolfs whelp. Be audited to him against the County by the Board of Supervisors on the presentation of a Propre Certificate of a Justice of the Peace and some other officer of the Town as provided by Sections 2,3, & 4 of Title 17 Chapter 20 part 1st of the Revised Statutes old Edition.

Section 2nd - The Electors of the several towns in the County of Delaware may at their annual town meeting or at there special Town meeting which may be called for any purpose , make such provisions and allow such rewards for the destruction of wolves, panthers & wild cats in their respective towns as they may deem necessary.

Section 3.- No person shall be entitled to such reward unless he be an inhabitant of the County in which the same is killed. The application for such town bounty shall be made to the town i which the wolf, panther or wild cat may be killed and al persons claiming such reward for the destruction of wolves, panthers or wild cats shall produce the same evidence as is required in the eighteenth till 20th chapter of 1st Revised Statutes old edition.

Section 4th - This act shall take effect immediately.

The Bill as originally offered by Horton proposed a bounty of \$15.00 for every full grown wolf scalp and \$5.00 for every whelp as per

Section 1st of the foregoing act. Ayes and Nays demanded.

On the **first day of February 1852**, and \$350.00 on the **first day of February 1853** without interest.

The committee to Examine Co. Buildings reported. Report on file.

Resolved that the Clerk of the Board be required to collect all the books, pamphlets & other documents belonging to the Board of Supervisors, & present them to the Board at the next meeting.

Board adjourned to 8 a.m. Saturday.

Saturday, 8 a.m. Board met, all present, minutes read & approved.

The vote allowing the account of **Burr Lyon** was reconsidered & the account laid over to next meeting on **motion** of *Mr. Parker*.

On **motion** of *Mr. Parker*

Resolved that a Committee of three persons be appointed by this Board to report a suitable place for a new jail & to estimate the probable expense for the erection of the same & report the same at the next meeting of this Board.

Resolved that **Daniel Rowland, Horace Griswold & G. H. Edgerton**, Esqs. constitute said committee.

On **motion** Board adjourned to meet at 1 p.m. on the **14th day of December**, next.

Johnson** & also for damages, costs & expenses paid by him for & on account of a suit brought against him as Trustee of said School District & **Peter Drummond**, in favor of **Agnes Dowie** by her next friend **Barney R. Johnson**, in all amounting to \$16.25, ought justly to be paid to the said **Peter N. Bassett** by said School District and a majority of all the members elected to the Board do hereby order & require that the said amount be paid to said **Peter N. Bassett** by said School District No. 2 of Andes.

The Committee appointed to examine the account of **Burr Lyon** reported. Report accepted & placed on file.

Mr. Brown moved to reconsider the vote on the **Resolution** passed Nov. 15th on **motion** of **Mr. Parker**, in relation to the distinction between Town & County Poor. The **motion** was decided to be out of order.

An appeal being taken from the decision of the chair, the following persons voted to sustain the decision. *Messrs. George, Elwood, Paine, Parker, Kentfield, Jackson, Allaben, Siver & Maples.* -9- To overrule the decision *Messrs. Brown, Waters, Wood, Miller, Penfield, Bunnell, Burhans & Griffin.* -8- Decision sustained.

Mr. Elwood & Mr. Parker were appointed to repair the Jury Box in the Court House & were authorized to draw from the Treasurer the necessary funds for the same.

The annual report of the Superintendents of the Poor was directed to be published in all of the papers in the Co.

Resolved that the Treasure be authorized to borrow money to supply any deficiency in the amount raised to meet the current expenses for the year.

On **motion** of Mr. Maples adjourned snic die.

The undersigned, a committee appointed by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Delaware, on the 13th day of November, 1852, to report a suitable place for and the probable expense of a new jail for said County respectfully report: That in pursuance of said Resolution they have the subject under consideration and have agreed to submit the following statement -

In their opinion an entire new jail need not be erected, but that a suitable addition may be made to the present one, which will answer the desired purpose. The addition is to be made to the north west end of the present building & is to be twenty four feet wide by eighteen feet deep, of sufficient height to make two stories or tier of cells. Each story or tier to have two cells, each cell to be as near as practicable twelve feet square. The outside wall of the cells to consist of square timber compactly placed together & fastened to each other with iron or other suitable fastings. The timber for such outside walls to be ten inches square of hemlock or hard wood as may be deemed best by the Board, though the estimates of the committee are based upon hemlock timbers. On the inside each story or tier is to be divided into two cells by walls to be made of timbers eight inches by ten. The inside of the cells to be lined with heavy sheet iron to be securely spiked on to the square timbers, upon the iron is to be fastened hard wood plank two inches thick to be fastened by iron spikes upon the outer timbres, the floors to be made as follows, first a course of square timber, eight inches square upon this a course of iron similar to that mentioned for the

walls & to be similarly fastened to the square timbers, upon that a course of hard wood, two inch plank & to be spiked to the timbers below, the plank for the floor & walls are not to be jointed at all in the cells except where the floors & walls meet, then the floors & wall are to be dovetailed together, in each is to be place a furnace. Each of the cells is to be warmed with hot air from the furnace, no sinks are to be built in the cells in the place of them tubs are to be used. These to be emptied into an outside sink between the rest of the cells & the present building is to be a hall six feet wide with a flight of stairs leading to the upper cells. The outer side of the outer walls is to be clapboarded & painted, the expenses are estimated at \$2000. It is deemed that this amount will be ample to make the building as strong as iron can make it. Your committee in this report do not make or recommend any disposition of the present of the cells as that was not referred to them, all which respectfully submitted.

Whereas the County Jail is in such a dilapidated condition as to render it unfit for the confinement of prisoners, therefore **RESOLVED**

1st that it is necessary that an addition to the same be erected & that **G. H. Edgerton & D. H. Pardee** are hereby appointed Commissioners for the purpose of superintending the erection of the same.

2nd **RESOLVED** that the said Commissioners are hereby authorized to erect an additional to the jail according to the plans submitted to the Board of Supervisors on the **15th Dec. 1852** by **G. H. Edgerton, D. Rowland & Horace Griswold**, except that the said Commissioners shall have authority to so enlarge the said plans as to make the cells 12 feet by 14 & 9 feet in height if they shall deem such enlargement necessary.

3rd **RESOLVED** that the said Commissioners are hereby authorized for the purpose of defraying the expense of erecting such building to loan the sum of \$2000 in such sums & at such times as may be necessary & give their note or bond for the said sum of money conditional for the payment of the same in annual installments of \$500 & interest on the first day of Feby. In each year & said note or bond so given by said Commissioners shall be deemed to be a debt against the County.

4th **RESOLVED** that the said Commissioners are further authorized to remove the cells in the present jail & furnish the same into suitable rooms for a dwelling if such alterations can be made for the additional sum of \$250 together with any surplus that may be of the \$2000 provided for the addition & they are authorize to loan the same on the same conditions as the before mentioned \$2000.

On reading & filing the application of the Sidney Bridge Company & on reading & filing a copy of the articles of association of said Company duly certified to be such copy by the State Engineer & Surveyor of the State of New York & by the Clerk of the County of Otsego & the Clerk of the County of Delaware & it appearing by such certificates that such articles of association have been duly filed in the State Engineer & Surveyor's Office & in the Clerk's Office of the County of Delaware & of the County of Otsego; And on proof of the due publication of a notice of this application in a public newspaper printed in said County of Delaware & in a public newspaper printed in said County of Otsego and a majority of all the members elected to said Board assenting thereto,

Ordered that said Company have authority to construct, keep & maintain a bridge across the Susquehannah River opposite the Village of Sidney Plains from the Town of Sidney in the County of Delaware to the Town of Unadilla in the County of Otsego & described as follows - a covered bridge about 2.50 long 16 feet wide & to have two tracks & constructed of wood & supported by stone abutments standing on each shore & a stone pier in the center of said River.

*And the said Company are hereby authorized to construct, keep & maintain such bridge under & by virtue of an act of the Legislature of the State of New York entitled "**an act to provide for the incorporation of Bridge Companies, passed April 11th 1848**" for the term of fifty years*

from the 3^d day of May 1853 & shall be known as the Sidney Bridge Company.

a Charter of the Sidney Bridge Company - At an annual meeting of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Delaware held at Delhi on the 16 day of November 1853.

On reading & filing the certificates of the Judge of Otsego County & the Certificate of the Judge of Delaware County, which certificates have been duly filed in the office of the Clerk of Delaware County & it appearing by said certificates that the Sidney Bridge Company own a bridge situate in the Counties of Delaware & Otsego across the Susquehannah River from the Town of Sidney, Delaware County to the Town of Unadilla Otsego County & that such Bridge is constructed & completed in a manner safe & convenient for the public use, and a majority of all the members elected to said Board assenting thereto

Ordered that said Company may erect a toll gate at such Bridge & demand & receive for the use of said Company a toll not exceeding the following rates to wit:

for every coach phaeton or other pleasure carriage drawn by four horses thirty seven & a half cents, drawn by two horse twenty five cents, drawn by one horse twelve 7 a half cents, for every wagon or cart other than pleasure carriages drawn by four horses, mules or oxen twelve & a half cents, drawn by one horse, or mule eight cents and for every additional horse mule or ox four cents. For every sleigh or sled drawn by two horses, mules or oxen twelve and a half cents for every sleigh or sled drawn by one horse or mule nine cents, for every horse & rider six cents, for every horse, jack or mule led or driven three cents, for every foot passenger two cents, for every score of cattle twenty five cents, for every score of sheep or hogs twelve & a half cents & in that proportion for a greater or less number.

The following **Preamble and Resolution** was presented by Mr. Morse and on his motion adopted -

"Whereas there is erroneously included in the tax roll of the Town of Middletown for the current year the sum of \$28.10 more than there should be, on account of rejected taxes and the same is ordered paid to the County Treasurer. Therefore,

Resolved that the Treasurer of the County be directed to place to the credit of the Town of Middletown, after the collector shall have made his return, the sum of \$28.10, to be drawn by the Supervisor of said Town, for the benefit of the Town."

Mr. Morse moved the following **resolution** which passed -

Resolved that if the sum *ordered* to be raised for the expenses of the current year shall be insufficient for that purpose, the Treasurer is hereby authorized to borrow on the credit of the County such sum as shall be sufficient to supply any deficiency.

On **motion** of **Mr. Morse**,

Resolved that the Collectors warrants be made returnable on the **15th day of February** next.

Board adjourned until the 14th at 8 a.m.

December 14th, 1854

On **motion** of **Mr. Morse** the account of **Matthew P. Brown** was reconsidered, and on his **motion** passed at \$62.56.

Mr. Hughston moved that the County Clerk be authorized to purchase four new books for the purpose of transcribing the old indexes and mortgages in the Clerk's office, and that the County Clerk be directed to transcribe the same. Ayes and Noes demanded.

Noes - *Messrs. Brown, Waters, Wood, Dayton, McKee, Kentfield, Elwood, Morse. -8- Motion declared lost.*

Mr. Wm. Murray appeared before the Board and presented a transcript of a judgment in favor of **Daniel B. Odell** of \$26.05 agt. **Thomas Durfee & David Nichols**, Oversees of the Town of Tompkins and asked that the same be audited.

Mr. Morse moved that the amount be charged to the Town of Tompkins. Ayes and Noes demanded.

Ayes - *Messrs. Hughston, Allison, Brown, Morse. -4-*

Noes - *Messrs. Radeker, Goodrich, Waters, Wood, Dayton, McKee, Mann, Elwood, Wattles, Grant, Maples, Mead. -12- Motion declared lost.*

On **motion** the account was referred to the Superintendents of the Poor.

A similar **motion** was made and carried in relation to the judgment agt. **T. Swart**, Overseers of the Poor of Davenport.

The report of **G. H. Edgerton**, from the building committee of jail & c. was presented and on **motion** accepted.

On **motion** the Treasurer was directed to pay to the Supervisors of the respective Towns 3 cents on each person paying a military commutation in the Town.

On **motion**

Resolved that the Clerk of the Board be allowed the sum of \$175 for his services the current year.

On motion the Board adjourned, sine die.

The children have been instructed the past year by a competent teacher, and have made reasonable improvements in learning.
