At a meeting of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Delaware in their room in the Court House in the Town of Delhi on the third Tuesday of June 1857 in pursuance of an act entitled "*an act for the apportionment of the members of assembly of this State*" passed by the Legislature of this State on the 13th day of April, 1857.

James R. Allaben, Clerk called the Board to order and the following named persons appeared from the several towns as Supervisors:

Davenport, Colchester, Hancock not represented.

Mr. Burhans, Supervisor from Roxbury moved that **Samuel Gordon**, Supervisor from Delhi be elected chairman of the Board for the present meeting only.

Which motion being put was unanimously carried and **Mr. Gordon** thereupon assumed the duties of the chair.

Mr. Maples, Supervisor from the Town of Tompkins, offered the following **resolution**.

Resolved That the towns of Colchester, Delhi, Franklin, Hamden, Hancock, Masonville, Sidney, Tompkins & Walton containing population of twenty one thousand six hundred and eighty four (21,684) form and constitute the first assembly district of the County of Delaware.

And that the towns of Andes, Bovina, Davenport, Harpersfield, Kortright, Meredith, Middletown, Roxbury and Stamford containing a population of eighteen thousand and sixty five (18065) form and constitute the second assembly district of the County of Delaware.

Aye and noes being ordered were as follows:

Resolution declared carried.

On motion of *Mr. Dickson* ordered that two copies of the proceedings of this meeting be signed by the Chairman and Clerk, and one filed in the Office of the Secretary of State and the other in the Office of the Clerk of the County of Delaware.

On motion the Board adjourned sine die.

1857

At a meeting of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Delaware, held at the Court House in Delhi, on the **tenth day of November, 1857.**

On motion of *Mr. Dickson*, the Board proceeded to the Election of a Chairman by ballot.

Charles Maples had ten votes, *Samuel Gordon* had eight votes. *Mr. Maples* was declared elected Chairman.

On motion of *Mr. Dickson*, the Board then proceeded to a random ballot for clerk. **O. W. Smith** had ten votes, **James R. Allaben** had seven votes.

The Board then proceeded to a final ballot for clerk, which resulted in no choice.

The Board, continued to ballot, till the fifth ballot, for Clerk, and no one being elected, the Board adjourned till the next morning at 8 o'clock a.m.

Wednesday, November 11th 8 a.m.

The Board met pursuant to adjournment, all the Supervisors present.

On motion of *Mr. Burhans*, the Board proceeded to ballot for Clerk.

O. W. Smith was then declared elected Clerk.

Mr. Allaben moved that a select committee of three be appointed by the chair on wolf bounties, and requested not to be placed on the committee. *Messrs. Burhans,*

Kiersted were appointed such committee.

The Chairman then announced the following standing committees.

Robert Parker, Esq., presented the claim of **Daniel McKinnion & Edward G. Heath**, Trustees of School District No. 12 Masonville and asked the Board to assess the claim on said District.

H. A. Clark, Esq. on behalf of some inhabitants of the District opposed the claim, and claimed that the Board had no jurisdiction to assess it on the District.

Mr. Gordon moved that the Board do not entertain the matter for want of jurisdiction.

The Ayes and Noes being demanded the motion was lost as follows:

When **Mr. Smith**'s name was called he was excused from voting by the Board, he being the Supervisor of Masonville and related to some of the parties.

On motion of **Mr. Gilchrist**, the matter was postponed till the next meeting of the Board.

S. H. White, on behalf of certain petitioners, presented a petition to the Board, asking for the erection of a new Town from the Towns of Walton & Tompkins, the centre thereof to be near Rock Rift.

On motion of **Mr. Allaben**, the matter was referred to a committee of three. **Messrs. Allaben, Shaw, Fisher** were appointed such committee.

Board adjourned to ½ past one o'clock p.m.

½ past one p.m. the Board met pursuant to adjournment. The roll was called and all the Supervisors answered.

The County Judge presented a report of the Lunatics sent to the asylum from this County the past year, which was read and on motion was received and placed on file.

The money for highways and bridges in the several towns was then ordered to be assessed on the several towns.

The Board adjourned till tomorrow 8 o'clock a.m.

Thursday November 12th 8 a.m.

The Board met pursuant to adjournment. The roll was called, all the Supervisors present.

On motion of **S. F. Miller** \$175 was ordered assessed on the town of Franklin for highway damages.

The Board adjourned to ½ past one p.m.

½ past one Board met pursuant to adjournment.

The Equalization committee submitted their report, which was read

Mr. Burhans moved to adjourn till ½ past 8 o'clock tomorrow morning.

The Ayes and Noes were demanded and the motion lost as follows:

On motion of **Mr. Burhans** the Board adjourned until ½ past 7 p.m.

½ past 7 the Board met pursuant to adjournment.

Mr. Gorden moved to adopt the report of the Equalizing Committee.

The Ayes and Noes were demanded and the reported adopted as follows;

The County Judge's report was then received and on motion placed on file.

On motion of **Mr. Gorden** \$250 was directed to be paid by the Treasurer to build a bridge across the Delaware River at Pepacton.

On motion the bills of **S. D. Hulce** for raking a mill pond, and attending the Grand Jury were referred to the committee on county claims.

The Board adjourned till 8 o'clock tomorrow.

Friday November 13th 8 a.m.

The Board met pursuant to adjournment.

The Equalizing Committee offered an amendment to the former report of the committee.

Mr. Burhans offered an amendment to the amendment of the committee as follows add to the real estate of Bovina 5 per cent, Colchester 33 1/3 per cent, Hancock 12 1/2 per cent, Masonville 4 per cent, Tompkins 5 per cent and deduct from Delhi 10 per cent, Kortright 4 per cent, Harpersfield 8 per cent, Stamford 10 per cent, Kortright 4 per cent.

The ayes and noes being called, **Mr. Burhans** amendment was declared lost as follows:

Noes: **Dickson, C. Miller, Gorden, S. F. Miller, Peters, Gilchrist, Smith, Allaben, Andrews, Fisher, North. 11**

The committee's amendment was then passed. The following is the report as amended and passed by the Board.

Resolved that the Clerk of this Board alter the equalized assessments of the several towns so as to make the equalized assessment as follows: Andes, seven dollars; Bovina ten dollars; Colchester five dollars; Davenport fifteen dollars; Delhi, sixteen dollars and fifty cents; Hamden ten dollars; Franklin sixteen dollars and a half; Kortright twelve dollars, Hancock seven dollars; Masonville nine dollars & fifty cents; Middletown seven dollars; Meredith twelve dollars; Harpersfield fifteen dollars; Roxbury thirteen dollars; Sidney fourteen dollars; Tompkins eight dollars; Stamford fifteen dollars; Walton ten dollars per acre of land.

Resolved that the Clerk reduce the equalization so that the aggregate amount of the equalized value of the real estate of the several towns shall be the same as the aggregate assessed value thereof.

The report of the Committee on the erection of new towns, was read and adopted. The report was adverse to the erection of the proposed new town.

On motion the rejected taxes were ordered to be assessed on the several towns.

The Board adjourned till 1/2 past 1 p.m.

1/2 past one, Board met pursuant to adjournment.

The Select Committee on wolf bounties reported to audit to **A. D. Freer** \$60 to be assessed on Middletown and \$20 on the County. Report adopted.

The Board adjourned to 1/2 past 6 p.m.

1/2 past 6 p.m. the Board met pursuant to adjournment.

The report of the Committee to settle with the Treasurer was presented by **Mr. Miller**, Chairman, and accepted.

On motion of **S.F. Miller** the following **resolutions** were read and passed:

Resolved that the Representatives in the State Legislature for the County of Delaware be requested to secure an amendment of the poor laws so as to require the Town Overseers of the Poor to make a full report to the Board of Town auditors of their respective Towns, of all relief orders granted by them, the names of the persons so

relieved and the necessity requiring it.

Resolved that the Clerk of this Board be instructed to forward a copy of the above **resolution** to the Senator and Member of Assembly.

The Committee on court house & jail reported \$40 to repair the same, which was adopted.

On motion of **Mr. Gorden** the report of the Committee on County Claims was adopted and the several amounts audited by the committee were allowed and passed by the Board.

The report of the Committee on Town accounts was presented and accepted and the several amounts audited by the committee was ordered to be assessed on the several Towns as reported.

The report of the Committee on Constables and Justices accounts was presented and accepted and the several amounts audited by them were ordered to be assessed on the several Towns.

Mr. Gorden moved to allow **A. J. Smith** \$6.28 in addition to the amount audited the committee. The motion of **Mr. Gorden** was lost.

The report of the Committee to settle with the Sheriff was read and accepted.

The Committee to settle with the Superintendents of the Poor presented their report which was adopted.

On motion of **Mr. Burhans**, the Sheriff was granted leave to present his account and report at the next meeting of this Board.

Mr. Burhans moved a special committee of three to ascertain the amount to be raised by the County for contingent expenses. **Messrs. Burhans, S. F. Miller and Allaben** were appointed such committee.

On motion of **Mr. Gorden** the following **resolution** was passed:

Resolved that the Clerk of the Board in estimating the taxes of the several Towns of this County as provided in the revised statutes add to the amount of County and Town charges three mills on the dollar or the valuation of real and personal estate which amount is to be paid by the County Treasurer into the State Treasury according to the several acts passed in relation to State taxes & school purposes.

Board adjourned to 8 a.m. tomorrow.

Saturday November 14th 8a.m.

Board met pursuant to adjournment.

The Superintendents of the Poor reported that they wanted \$3000 raised for the poor fund the ensuing year. The report was read.

On motion of **Mr. Gorden** it was

Resolved that there be published in *The Delaware Gazette and Delaware Express* the Session Laws, Town and County accounts, and County Judges Report. That there be published in *The Bloomville Mirror* the Town & County accounts, and equalization of the assessment rolls, that there be published in the *Franklin Visitor* the Town and County accounts and equalization of the assessment rolls and report of the Superintendents of the Poor and in the *Deposit Union Democrat* the Town and County accounts, equalization of the assessment rolls and report of the Superintendents of the Poor.

On motion of **Mr. Gorden** \$2,500 was ordered to be raised for the poor fund.

The Special Committee reported to raise \$7000 for contingent expenses the ensuing year, which was adopted.

On motion of *Mr. Burhans* it was

Resolved that the County Judge & Surrogate be authorized to purchase an iron safe at a cost not exceeding three hundred dollars for the use of his office and to draw on the Treasurer for the money to pay for said safe when purchased.

On motion it was

Resolved that the Commissioners of Schools publish the necessary notices for Teachers drills and Teachers Institutes in *Bloomville Mirror* and *Franklin Visitor*.

On motion it was

Resolved that the County Treasurer be and he hereby is authorized to borrow money sufficient to meet and deficiency in the contingent fund of the County, on the faith and credit of the County.

On motion it was

Resolved that the penalty in **Joseph H. Tyrells** bond as Superintendent of the Poor of this County be \$1000.

The Bond of **Horatio N. Buckley** the Treasurer was then approved and filed in the County Clerk's office.

On motion of *Mr. Gorden, Gabriel S. Mead of Walton, Stephen C. Johnson of Delhi, Stephen Hine of Franklin, Lemmuell Sines, Middletown & John Hitchcolk* were appointed Plank Road and Turnpike inspectors.

Mr. Shaver offered the following **resolution** which was laid on the table.

The Supervisor of Colchester would represent that an account passed by the Board of Supervisors of the County in 1855. Was taken from the files of the Clerk of the Board and again presented to the auditing Board of said Town of Colchester and also represents that the record book of the Supervisors of this County containing the proceedings of this County back or previous to the year 1855 is not in the office of the Board of Supervisors but is stated by the late Clerk to be loaned out of the office in a Town remote from here, and would therefore offer the following **resolution**.

Resolved that we consider the late Supervisors Clerk has been imprudent acted wrong and has made himself liable to be censured by this Board an it is the opinion of this Board of Supervisors he has acted wrong in loaning the books and papers of this office.

On motion of *Mr. Gorden* the Board adjourned to the 8th day of December next at 12 o'clock M.

ADJOURNED MEETING

December 8th, 1857

The Board met pursuant to adjournment. The roll was called and all the Supervisors answered to their names.

Several bills were reported to the Committee on County Claims. The Committee reported that the bills be laid on the table. Carried.

The sum of \$155 was ordered assessed on the Town of Stamford to pay highway damages.

Board adjourned till 8 o'clock tomorrow morning.

Wednesday December 9th, 1857 8 a.m.

Board met pursuant to adjournment.

The Superintendent of the Poor presented their report.

Mr. Allaben moved to receive the report. **Mr. Miller** moved to amend by laying the report on the table.

Mr. Allaben accepted the amendment and the report was tabled.

On motion of **Mr. Dixon** the Masonville School District matter was made a special order for 2 o'clock this p.m.

On motion it was ordered that the \$250 ordered to be raised to build a bridge at Colchester be paid by the Treasurer to the Supervisor of Colchester.

The bill of **Jonas M. Smith** late Supervisor, was presented for returning collectors bond.

Mr. Burhans moved to reject the bill and demanded the Ayes and Noes. The motion was lost by the following vote:

Ayes: **Gorden, Burhans, Andrews. 3**

Noes: **Dickson, Archibald, Shaver, C. Miller, S. F. Miller, Shaw, Kiersted, Peters, Gilchrist, Smith, Sands, Allaben, Fisher, Maples, North. 15**

The bill was then passed.

On motion of **Mr. Burhans** the Treasurer was allowed to purchase a desk for the papers in his office at a cost not exceeding \$25.

On motion of **Mr. Gorden, Mr. Porter's** bill of \$25 was reconsidered and his whole claim passed at \$25.

The Board adjourned till 2 o'clock p.m.

2 o'clock p.m. Board met pursuant to adjournment.

The Committee to settle with the U.S. Loan Commissioners presented their report, which was laid on the table on motion.

On motion of **Mr. Gilchrist** the bills of **Drs. McNaught and Covill** were reconsidered and the bills of **Drs. McNaught, McLaury & Covill** were sent to the committee on county claims.

The committee on Sheriff's accounts made a further report which on motion was adopted and the bills audited by the Committee were passed.

The committee on county claims presented their report. **Mr. Gilchrist** moved to adopt the report.

Mr. Miller moved to amend by laying the bills on the table till they were certified by the Coroner.

Mr. Miller's motion was lost.

The report of the committee was then adopted.

Mr. Parker on behalf of the School District Trustees of District No. 12 in the Town of Masonville asked the Board to assess the amount of their bill on said School District.

Mr. Hughston, on behalf of some of the inhabitants of said District, objects & claims that the papers were no served in time

On motion of **Mr. Burhans** the Board proceeded to hear the matter.

Mr. Hughston objects on the ground that the matter has never been submitted to the inhabitants of said District and they have never voted to allow the claims.

Also that sufficient notice has not been given. It being served yesterday.

Also that the Board have no jurisdiction of the matter.

Adjourned to ½ past 6 p.m.

½ past 6 p.m. Board met pursuant to adjournment.

The school matter was continued, affidavits and papers were read, which are on file.

Mr. Allaben offered the following **resolution**:

Resolved that in the opinion of this Board the account of **Daniel McKinnon & Edward E. Heath**, late trustees of District No. 12 in the Town of Masonville for damages costs and expenses paid by them for and on account of a judgment obtained by **Edward L. Bradstreet** against them. When such Trustees amounting to \$573.01 ought justly to be paid to them, and a majority of all the members elected to the Board hereby order that the pine lumber belonging to them by virtue of said judgment be taken by them at the amount of appraisal given by the jury giving said judgment (\$150) and that the ballance \$423.01 be paid to the said **Daniel McKinnon & Edward E. Heath** by the said District No. 12 in the Town of Masonville.

The Ayes and Noes being demanded the **resolution** passed by the following vote:

Ayes: **Dickson, Archibald, Shaver, C. Miller, S. F. Miller, Shaw, Kiersted, Gilchrist, Sands, Allaben, Andrews, Fisher, Maples, North. 14**

Noes: **Gorden, Peters. 2**

Board adjourned to 11 o'clock a.m. Dec.

Thursday December 10th

Board met pursuant to adjournment.

The Loan Mortgages were read.

Board adjourned to ½ past one p.m.

½ past one p.m. Board met pursuant to adjournment.

The following **resolution** was passed:

Resolved That the United States Deposit Fund Loan Commissioners be requested to inquire into the sufficiency of the security of Mortgages Nos. 71 & 243 and if in their judgment such security shall not be deemed sufficient to demand additional security or payment of the same.

Mr. Allaben offered a **resolution** to revive the distinction between Town & County Poor, which was laid on the table by consent.

On motion of **Mr. Allaben** the Supts. of Poor report was taken up.

On motion of **Mr. Miller** the Supts. of the Poor report was adopted.

The supplementary report of the Supts. of Poor was read and on motion adopted and ordered printed.

The **resolution** in regard to reviving the distinction between Town & County poor was taken up.

Mr. Allaben moved to adopt the **resolution** which is as follows:

Resolved That the distinction between Town and County poor in the County of Delaware be revived and that the distinction go into effect on the **first day of January**

1858.

The **resolution** passed by the following vote:

Ayes: *Dickson, Archibald, Shaver, C. Miller, S. F. Miller, Shaw, Peters, Gilchrist, Smith, Sands, Allaben, Burhans, Andrews, Fisher. 14*

Noes: *Gorden, iersted, Maples, North.*

Mr. Gilchrist then took the chair.

Mr. Maples offered the following **resolution**

Resolved that hereafter but one County Superintendent of the Poor be elected in and for this County.

The **resolution** passed by the following vote.

Ayes: *Dickson, Archibald, Shaver, C. Miller, Gorden, Shaw, Kiersted, Peters, Gilchrist, Smith, Sands, Allaben, Burhans, Fisher, Maples, North. 16*

Noes: *S. F. Miller, Andrews. 2*

Mr. Kiersted offered a **resolution** in regard to game.

Mr. Allaben offered an additional **resolution** and on his motion the matter was referred to a select committee of three. Messrs. *Allaben, Kiersted & Archibald* were appointed such committee.

The committee to settle with the Loan Commissioners had leave to take their report from the table.

Mr. Allaben offered a **resolution** that the Treasurer be authorized to borrow on the credit of the County a sum not exceeding \$1500.00 to pay the poor debt, which was passed.

Mr. Gilchrist in the chair.

On motion of *Mr. Maples* the sheriff was authorized to insure the County buildings and draw on the County Treasurer for the necessary funds.

The special committee reported the following game law, which was passed:

Section 1st. No person or persons shall catch take or destroy any trout found in the water of tis county between the first day of September in any year and the first day of March thereafter.

Section 2d. No person or persons shall catch with a net any fish in the water of tis county between the first day of December in any year and the first day of April following.

Section 3d. Whoever shall violate any provision of this act shall for each and every offence forfeit the sum of twenty five dollars to be sued for and recovered with costs of suit by any person who shall prosecute for the same in his own name in any court having jurisdiction of the same said fine to belong to the poor fund of the Town where the offence is committed.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

On motion of *Mr. Maples* the **resolution** authorizing the Treasurer to borrow money for the poor fund was reconsidered.

On motion of *Mr. Maples* the **resolution** was amended by inserting \$3,000 in the place of \$1,500.

Adjourned to ½ past 6 p.m.

½ past 6 p.m. Board met pursuant to adjournment

Mr. Gilchrist in the chair.

Mr.C. Miller moved to reconsider the report of the equalizing committee.

Mr. Gorden moved to lay the motion on the table.

Mr. Maples called for the previous question and demanded the ayes and noes.

Mr. Allaben claimed the motion out of order.

The Chair decided the motion out of order.

Mr. Maples appealed and demanded the ayes & noes. The chair sustained by the following vote.

On motion of **Mr.Allaben** the motion was laid on the table.

On motion of **Mr. Gorden** the motion was taken from the table & passed.

Adj. to 8 a.m. tomorrow morning.

8 a.m. Board met pursuant to adjournment.

Mr.Gilchrist moved to raise \$2000 for the poor fund in addition to the previous sum raised.

The Chair decided the motion out of order. **Mr.Gilchrist** appealed and the Chair was sustained by the following vote:

Mr. Gilchrist moved to adjourn till Monday 8 a.m. motion lost.

Adj. till 2 o'clock p.m.

2 p.m. Board met pursuant to adjournment.

The committee to settle with the Loan Commissioners reported. Report accepted.

On motion the blanks in the collectors warrants were filled up with 15th February next.

The bills of the Supervisors were passed, also the clerk's bill.

The minutes were read & approved.

Mr. Gilchrist in the Chair.

Mr. Gorden moved a **resolution** of thanks to the Chairman for the able impartial manner in which he had presided which was passes unanimously.

Adjourned Sine Die.

COUNTY ACCOUNTS

Mr. Clark offered the following:

Resolved That the **resolution** passed by this Board on the *10th day of December, 1857* and which is as follows - "**Resolved**, That hereafter but one County Superintendent of the Poor be elected in and for this County" - be and the same is hereby rescinded and annulled. *Adopted*

Mr. Elwood offered the following:

Resolved That the sm of \$340 be levied upon the County of Delaware for the purchase of a safe for the Surrogate's office and expense of transportation of the same and that the Surrogate be authorized to purchase the same and draw on the Treasurer therefor. **Adopted.**

Mr. Gordon offered the following:

Resolved That the Sheriff of the County of Delaware report to this Board what fines and penalties have been collected and received by him and his deputies since he came into the office of Sheriff, and how and in what manner the same have been disposed of. **Adopted**

Mr. Gilchrist, Chairman of the Equalization Committee, asked leave to withdraw the Report of that Committee, now lying on the table, for further consideration of the Committee. **Granted**

A communication was received from **A. G. Burhans**, sheriff, requesting permission to have his accounts audited at the next meeting of the Board. On Motion of **Mr. Clark** the leave asked by the Sheriff was granted.

The Committee appointed to settle with the Treasurer reported through their Chairman, **J. P. Benjamin**. Report accepted.

On motion the board adjourned until tomorrow morning at 8 a.m.

November 13th 8 a.m.

*I certify the following to be a true and accurate copy of the report made by the Superintendent of the Poor to the Board of Supervisors, at their Session in **Dec. 1858.***

The Superintendents of the Poor of Delaware County, present to the Supervisors the following Annual Report:-

*There has been expended for the support of the poor at the County House, from **Nov. 1st, 1857 to Nov. 1st, 1858**, the sum of \$2,899.80, which sum includes the expenses for clothing, provisions, doctors' bills at the Poor House, keeper's salary, wages of hired man, and all incidental expenses to carry on the Poor House Farm.*

*There has been had at the Poor House during said year, 3,222 week's board by the poor kept at the house, at an average cost of 90 cents per week. Of that number of week's board, there has been had by poor persons belonging to the different towns to support, since **Jan. 1st, 1858**, 1,600 weeks and 3 days, at 90 cents per week, amounting to the sum of \$1,40.32, charged as follows:*

Which is not included in the foregoing figures, for the reason that they do not constitute any part of the expense of supporting the poor at the Count House, but should be added to the charges against the towns from which such expenses accrued.

There remains to be charged to the County 1,621 weeks and 4 day's board, at 90 cts. per week, amounting to the sum of \$1,459.48, in which sum is included the proportionate part of keeper's salary, wages of hiredman, doctor's bills at the Poor House, and incidental expenses of carrying on the Poor House farm, to which add the amount charged to the several towns, viz: \$1,44.32 making the sum total as above stated \$2,899.80.

There is also to be added expenses for county to pay the following bills, namely:

For that part of transportation checks not chargeable to the towns \$ 34.58

There has been expended by overseers of the different towns, for the relief of county poor, including doctor's bills and funeral expenses, and presented to the Superintendents to audit 170.67

There has also been expended for permanent fixtures at the poor house premises, such as lumber, carpenter work, stoves, and other repairs, chargeable to the county 252.46

To which add that part of the expense already embraced in the expenses at the poor house for board & c 1,459.48

\$1,917.19

Which shows the expense for supporting the poor belonging to the county to pay for the year ending Nov. 1st, 1858.

The Superintendents take the above figures as their estimate, and recommend that there be raised and placed to the poor fund the sum of \$2,000.00 for the support of the poor for the coming year.

The Superintendents had drawn checks on the Treasurer, at the time of settling with Supervisor's Committee, for \$4,242.46 in which was included old debts \$3,105.48

Also for accounts occurring for last year's expenses 1,136.98

\$4,242.76

There remains in the hands of the Superintendent's to be audited to liquidate the expenses, accounts and bills for the last year, the sum of \$1,762.82, which, when added to the sums audited, viz: 1,136.98 makes the sum expended for the last year, 2,899.80.

The Treasurer has paid Superintendent's checks \$4,132.29. It is found that by examining the Treasurer's books, that checks are remaining in the hands of the holders that have not been presented to the Treasurer for payment tot he amount of \$110.17, making \$4,242.46.

It will be seem that the discrepancy between the checks issued and the amount paid by the Treasurer, which was not discovered at the last Supervisor's meeting, namely, \$110.17, will make a deficiency of that amount unprovided for.

The Superintendents, recommend that every person having claims against the poor fund, present the same to the Superintendents in time to be audited by them before the 1st of November in each year, which would enable them to present each year's account by itself, and would prevent the blending of two or more years' bills in one report.

On motion of **Mr. Clark**

Resolved that the report of the Superintendents of the Poor be accepted.

Mr. Douglass offered a **Preamble and Resolution** directing the clerk to notify the comptroller of a deficiency in the U.S.D.Fund in order that he may take such action in the premises as he may deem proper. The **resolution** was adopted.

Resolved that **Mr. A. B. Douglass** be allowed six dollars for attending to organize the first meeting of the Board.

The bills of the different Supervisors were then examined & passed.

Mr. Doyle of Hancock srved notices on the Chairman and Clerk of the Board, that he appeals to the Comptroller from the discussion of the Board fixing the Equalization on his Town.

Resolved that **S. Gordon** be appointed t take charge of the matter on behalf of the Board.

A vote of thanks was then given to **Mr. Gordon** for the able impartial manner with which he had presided over the Board.

I certify the following to be a true and accurate copy of the report made by the Superintendents of the Poor to the Board of Supervisors at their session in December, 1859.

The Superintendents of the Poor of Delaware County present to the Board fo Supervisors the following annual report:

There has been expended for the support of the poor at the County House from November 1st, 1858 to November 1st, 1859 the sum of \$2,297.08.

Which sum includes expenses of clothing, provisions and Physician bills at the House, Keeper's salary, wages of hired man and all the incidental expenses to carry on the Poor House.

There has been had by the poor at the House during the current year, 2,572 weeks and 4 days board, at an average cost of 89 1/4 cents per week. Of that number of weeks' board thre has been had by poor persons belonging to the several towns to support for the year ending November 1st, 1859, 1,902 weeks and 1 day board, at 89 1/4 cents per week, which amounts to the sum of \$1,697.96, charged as follows:

As there is a larger amount due the count from the several towns than there was 1st year, the Superintendents think the sum of \$2,000 raised will be sufficient for current expenses and pay the balance the poor fund is in debt.

The whole number of poor supported at the Poor House was 98. Of this number 36 were county poor and 62 were town poor. Discharged 40, bound out 8, died 6, remaining in the Poor House, **November 1st, 1859** 44: idiots, 9; insane, 13; deaf and dumb 1.

REPORT OF THE COMMISSIONER OF EXCISE OF THE COUNTY OF DELAWARE

To the Board of Supervisors of the County of Delaware:

In obedience to a **resolution** served upon the undersigned, one of the Commissioners of Excise in and for the County of Delaware on the **13th of December, 1859**, "*that the Commissioners of Excise report to this Board of Supervisors at their present session, the names of all persons prosecuted by their direction for violations of the excise law, and the different amounts of moneys including costs, received by them and their attorneys from each person so prosecuted, and also each and every amount received for such violations where no prosecution has been had; such report to extend to the last tow years*"-begs leave to submit the following Report:

That the following actions have been commenced in the name of the Board of Commissioners above named by their late attorney, **William Murray, Jr.**, and the same are still pending, have been settled or are in judgment, or have been disposed of in the manner hereinafter stated, to wit:

Supreme Court

The Board of Commissioners of Excise of the County of Delaware *agt* **Jacob More**. The Deft. appeared by his Attorney and interposed a defence, and the action is undetermined and still pending.

The same *agt*. **George Dixon**. Judgment obtained \$100 damages, costs \$38. The Deft. paid to the Plffs. Attorney the costs and twenty dollars (\$20) of the damages. The Plff. gave the Deft. a stipulation, if he committed no further violations of the Excise law, the balance fo the judgment should not be collected.

The same *agt*. **Wm. Stratton**. The Deft. died soon after the commencement of the suit, and thereupon the action was discontinued by Plff.

The same *agt*. **John Burtch**. Judgment obtained for \$100 damages. Costs \$17.50. Deft. has paid the costs and the Plff. gave same stipulation as mentioned in the action against **Dixon**.

The same *agt*. **Smith Haner**. Judgment obtained for \$50 damages. Costs \$56.66. Nothing paid or collected.

The same *agt*. **R. Houghtailing**. Judgment for \$50 damages. Costs. \$18.68. The Deft. has paid Plff's. Attorney the costs, and took a like stipulation as mentioned above in the cases of **Dixon and Burtch**.

The same *agt*. **B. McCall**. Judgment for \$100 damages. Costs. \$19. Nothing has been paid by or collected of the Deft. and he is deemed irresponsible.

The same *agt*. **T. Goodrich**. Judgment for \$100 damages. Costs \$28. Nothing paid or collected.

The same *agt*. **Leman P. Reed**. Judgment for \$100.00 damages. Costs, \$19.27. The Deft. paid Plff's. Attorney the costs and recieved a stipulation from the Plff. of the same characgter as in the case of **Dixon** and others mentioned.

JUSTICE'S COURT

The same *agt*. **Issac Swart**. Judgment for \$100.00 damages and costs. The Deft. has paid the Plff's. costs and fifteen dollars damages, which were paid to the town where Deft. resides, to wit: the Town of Davenport. Plff. gave Deft. a stipulation as in the cases of **Dixon** and others, as above mentioned. The Deft. also paid Plff's. Attorney for his services of \$5.00.

JUSTICE'S COURT

The same *agt*. **Benjamin B. Wade**. Judgment for \$100.00 damages and costs. The Deft. paid Plff's. costs five dollars to Plff's. Attorney for his services and fifteen dollars for damages. Plff. gave a stipulation, as above mentioned to the Deft.

JUSTICE'S COURT

The same *agt. John Mead*. Judgment for \$100.00 damages and costs. Nothing paid or collected.

JUSTICE'S COURT

The same *agt. Hiram Hitt*. The Deft. paid Plff's costs and five dollars to Plff's. Attorney for his services, and action discontinued.

JUSTICE'S COURT

The same *agt. Joselyn*. This action, on advice given by the Overseers of the Poor to Plff's Attorney, was discontinued on payment of Plff's. costs and five dollars to Plff's. Attorney for his services.

JUSTICE'S COURT

The same *agt. William Y. Burns*. Action settled and discontinued on payment, by Deft. of Plff's. costs and five dollars to Plff's. Attorney for his services.

The undersigned would state that the twenty dollars paid to Plff's. Attorney in the case of **Dixon**, the fifteen dollars in the case of **Wade**, and five dollars in the case of **Burns**, have been paid over by the Plff's. Attorney to the County Treasurer of Delaware County, as required by the Statute.

The undersigned further reports that the following actions have been commenced by said Commissioners of Excise through its present Attorney, **Stephen C. Johnson**, and the same are still pending, or have been disposed of in manner following, to wit:

SUPREME COURT

The Board of Commissioners & c *agt John Swart*, of Davenport. Action commenced **Aug. 15th, 1859**, for violation of the 13th and 14th section of the Excise Law. Deft. has no license, has appeared by Attorney and interposed a defence and the action is still pending.

The same *agt John Hunter*, of Hancock. Action commenced **August 17th, 1859** for violation of the 13th section of the Excise Law, and for selling strong and spirituous liquors on Sundays. The Deft. has a license as a tavern keeper, and on payment by him of the Plff's. Attorney costs and disbursements. to wit., the sum of \$13.03 and the sum of \$6.97 equal to the sum in the whole of \$20.00, the action was discontinued and settled.

The same *agt John Boyd* of Meredith. Action commenced **Sept. 7th, 1859**, on complaint for violations of the 13th and 14th sections of the Excise Law. The Deft. has no license, has appeared by Attorney, and interposed a defence and the action is still pending.

The same *agt William Rowland* of Kortright. Action commenced **Oct. 22nd, 1859** on complaint for the violation of the 13th section of the Excise Law, and for selling strong and spirituous liquors on Sundays. The Deft. is licensed as a tavern keeper and on payment by him of \$12.50 the Plff's. Attorney's costs and disbursements, and confessing judgment for \$50.00 the Plff. gave Deft. a stipulation not to collect the judgment unless in case of further violation of said law.

The same *agt Hiram Hitt* of Colchester. Action commenced **Oct. 24th, 1859** on complaint for violations of the 13th and 14th sections of the Excise Law. The Deft. has no license, and on payment by him of the Plff's Attorney costs and disbursements, to wit: the sum of \$12.50 and confessing a judgment for \$50.00, the Plff. gave Deft. a stipulation, in substance, not to collect said judgment unless in case of further violation by said Deft.

The same *agt John Swart* of Davenport. Action commenced **Nov. 24th, 1859** on complaint for violations of the Excise Law, committed by said Deft, subsequent to the violations mentioned in the foregoing action against him. Det. has appeared by Attorney and answered the complaint, and the action is still pending.

The same *agt Jonathan P. Flower* of Delhi. Action commenced **Nov. 26th, 1859** on complaint for violations of the 13th section of the Excise Law, and for selling strong and spirituous liquors on Sundays. The Deft. has a license as a tavern keeper. He has not appeared nor answered the complaint; the action is still pending, the time for answering not having expired.

The foregoing actions are all that have been commenced by the Board of Commissioners of Excise above mentioned, that the undersigned has any knowledge of, and

contains the names of all the Defendants or persons prosecuted as he is informed and believes true, within the last two years proceeding the day of the service of the above mentioned **resolution** of this Board on the undersigned. That no moneys have been received by the Board of Commissioners of Excise above mentioned nor by its Attorneys for violations of the said Excise Law where no prosecution have been had, to the knowledge and belief of the undersigned.

In conclusion, the undersigned further states that he is the only member of the said Board of Commissioners present, and the short time he has had to make this report, precludes him from making any extended remarks as to the reasons that have governed the Board in the disposition of the actions above mentioned. The undersigned would respectfully submit, however, that the governing principle with himself (and he believes with his colleagues) have been to enforce the provisions of the Excise Act, firmly, but not rashly or violently and where the Board have had satisfactory assurances from the persons prosecuted or otherwise, that they have been mistaken as to the provisions of said Act, or have evinced a disposition in future to observe its provisions; they deemed it best for the public interest not to insist upon the payment of the full amount of the sum recovered, or that might be recovered.

All which is respectfully submitted.
